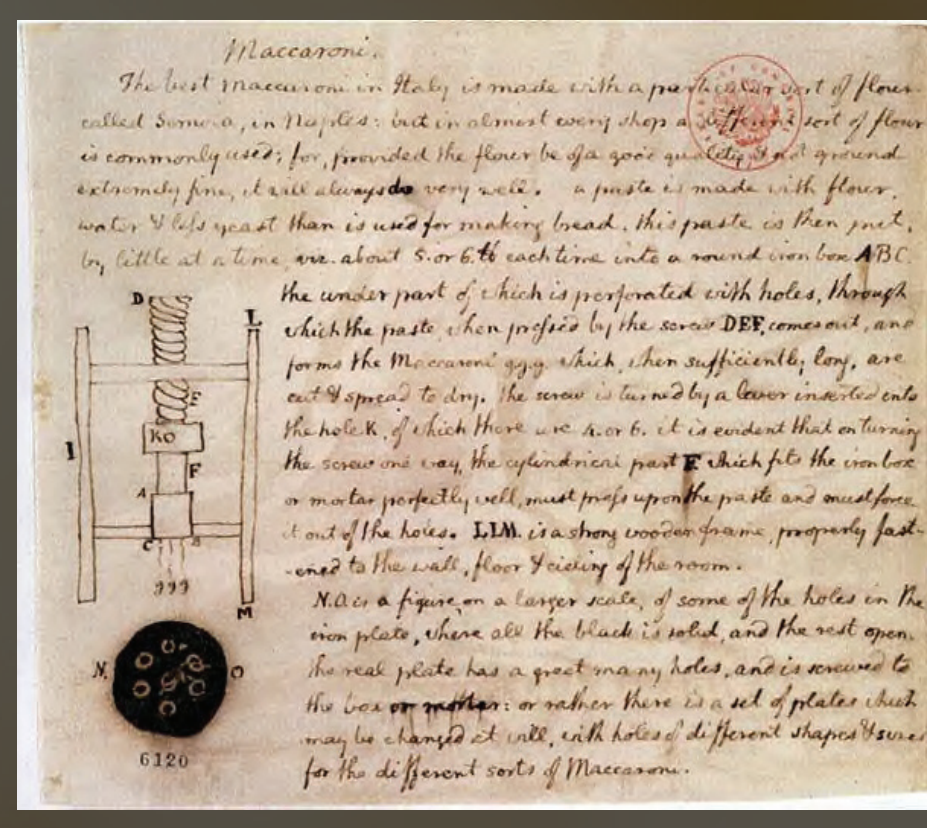
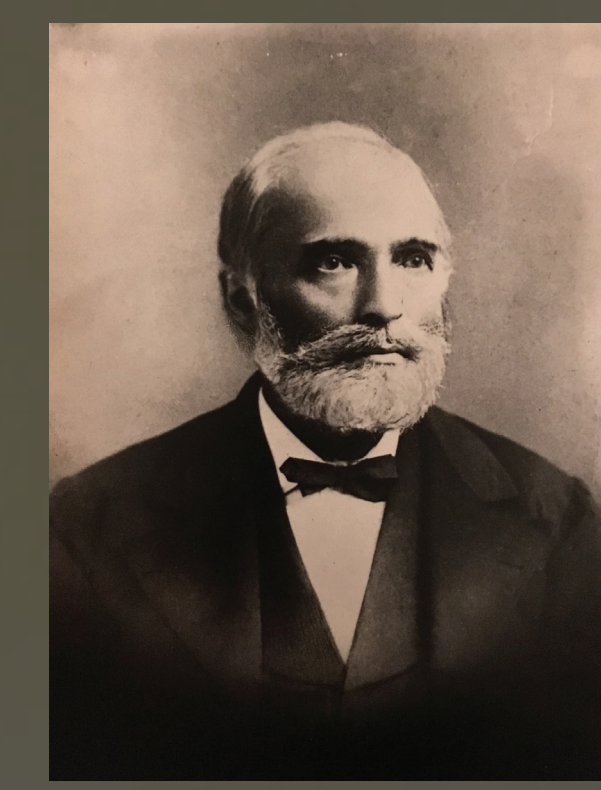


Based on his travels to Northern Italy, Thomas Jefferson drew a "macaroni" machine with instructions for making pasta



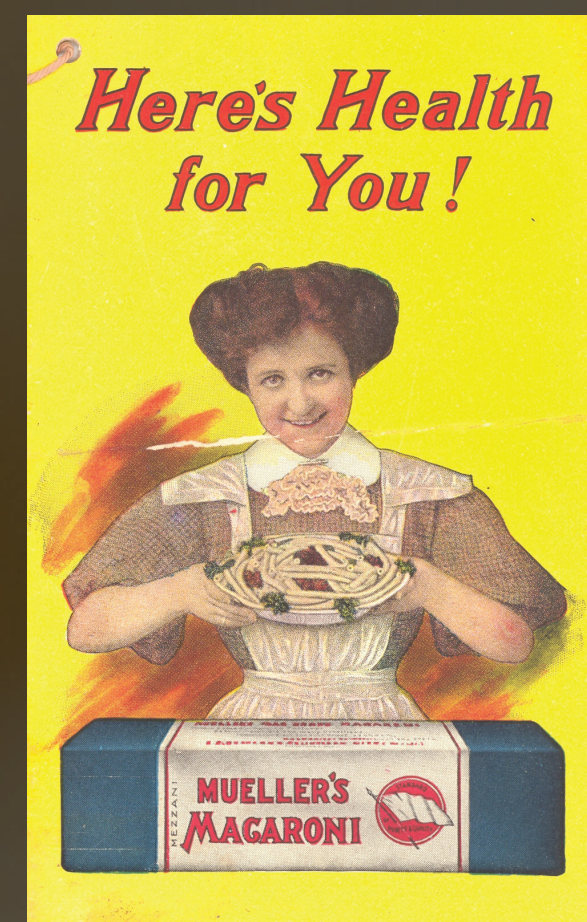

Bicocchi & Laneri created the Fort Worth Macaroni Company

Felice Maldari started F. Maldari Manufacturers of Pasta Dies

The National Association of Macaroni & Noodle Manufacturers of America, forerunner of today's NPA, is formed. Dues are \$5.

Anthony Gioia founded Gioia Macaroni Company in Buffalo, New York

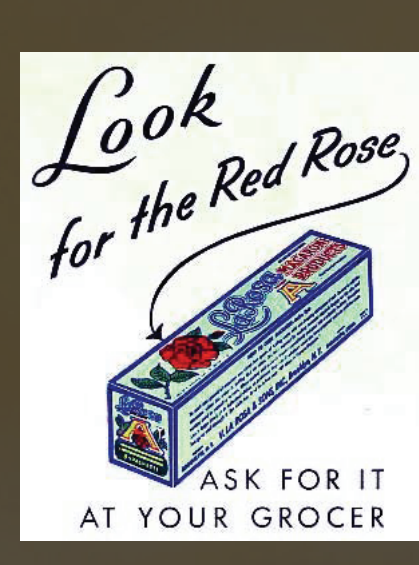
DeDomenico family delivers pasta around San Francisco, starting Golden Grain Macaroni Company

Vincenzo La Rosa founded V. La Rosa & Sons Macaroni Company in Brooklyn, New York



I. DeFrancisci & Son of Brooklyn, New York (forerunner of DEMACO), built their first pasta machine in the USA

Antonio Marano founded Philadelphia Macaroni Company

Emanuele Ronzoni started Ronzoni Macaroni Company in Queens, New York



1915

Imports of Italian pasta ended abruptly during World War I creating an enormous demand for domestic production

The National Macaroni Manufacturers Association gets the government to agree that all products termed as "alimentary paste," "Macaroni," "Spaghetti," "Vermicelli," "Noodles," or "Short Cuts," to be called under the general term of "Macaroni Products"

Pennsylvania Dutch-Megs Company opened in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania

Italian immigrant John Robillo and his Memphis-born wife Jennie founded Ronco Pasta

Ettore Boiardi launches Chef Boyardee brand of canned pasta

Kraft introduced Macaroni & Cheese Dinner in the USA

Macaroni manufacturing industry comprised of approximately 400 factories producing one-half billion pounds of product annually

Donato Maldari renames D. Maldari & Sons, Inc., to include Ralph & Dan Maldari

Numerous GIs are introduced to pasta as the War Department feeds over 12 million servicemen and women in World War II

The Durum Growers Association of the United States is incorporated on January 31

Rising starlet Sophia Loren named "Macaroni Week Queen"

The approximate date "pasta" becomes the general term for the category

Period of industry consolidation with General Foods acquiring Ronzoni, Borden acquiring Ronco & Hershey acquiring the American Beauty Macaroni Company

Richard Thompson founded the American Italian Pasta Company in Excelsior Springs, Missouri

1,042 farmers formed co-op to create Dakota Growers Pasta, a durum mill & pasta processing facility in North Dakota

Ignatius DeFrancisci, Joseph L. DeFrancisci, & Robert Ronzoni formed Pasta Montana in Great Falls, Montana

1996

1998-2001

New World Pasta acquired Creamette, Prince, American Beauty, P&R, Ronzoni & San Giorgio



Philadelphia Macaroni Company built a mill in Minot, North Dakota, named Minot Milling Company

Post Holdings acquired Dakota Growers Pasta Company

TreeHouse Private Brands purchased ConAgra Foods private label division, including pasta

New World Pasta operates under the name Riviana Foods as part of merger

Mexico-based La Moderna will open its first pasta factory on US soil in Cleburne, TX under the name of Interamerican Foods in May
